Third Week of Easter

On the **Third Sunday of Easter, Luke's Gospel** has the very human story of Jesus' appearing to the disciples after the Resurrection, inviting them to touch his hands and feet to see that he is real. He ate with them and "he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures."

In our first readings from **Acts of the Apostles** this week, we read of one of the earliest martyrs, Stephen and of Philip converting an Ethiopian slave along the road.

Also this week is the story of Saul, persecutor of Christians being blinded and then healed by Ananias in the name of Jesus.

The week ends with Peter traveling the region and healing.

The gospel for this week is from Chapter 6 of **John's Gospel** on Jesus as the "**Bread of Life.**"

Like so many stories in this gospel, Jesus teaches from one layer of understanding to another, taking us deeper into understanding his gift of himself to us in the Eucharist.

Jesus says, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life." "The bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world."

"Whoever eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood remains in me and I in him."

This marvelous dialogue ends with this exchange with his disciples: "Jesus then said to the Twelve,

'Do you also want to leave?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."'

For the **Fourth Sunday of Easter** we reflect on the Paschal Mystery more deeply.

Psalm 118 says, "The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone."

Peter quotes this psalm in preaching that the crippled man was healed.

"in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead."

In **John's Gospel**, Jesus tells us, "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

Grades 1-6 Hybrid Classroom Model

Students will attend an in-person class one time per month (Tuesday or Wednesday) from 4:00 PM-5:15 PM; then complete online assignments for rest of the month. If COVID conditions improve, we will move to all in-person classes with no online assignments.

Grades 1-6 Family Faith

Parents will teach children the monthly lessons at home with the assistance of online resources.

Students will also attend one half hour Zoom session for **7 months on Sundays after the 11:30 AM Mass** (times will be assigned by grade)

Families will attend 2 family retreats during Advent and Lent from 12:30 PM-3:00 PM on assigned Sundays

Grades 7-8

Students will complete monthly assignments and community service & attend one in-person class per month (Tuesdays from 7:00 PM-8:15 PM)

If COVID conditions improve we will adjust in-person attendance accordingly.

Grade 9 Immediate Confirmation Prep

Students will meet one time per month for an in-person session

(Sundays starting at the 11:30 AM Mass until 2:00 PM) along with community service assignments.

SPONSOR LETTERS

Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic (Confirmed).

An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly, by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

ARE YOU REGISTERED?

We have people coming to Our Lady of Lourdes on a regular basis who need a form of some kind filled out and, when we check our records, we find that they are not registered parishioners.

ARE YOU REGISTERED AS A PARISHIONER OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES?

If you are not, it becomes more complicated if you need some kind of form to be filled out stating that you are a parishioner. The best way for you to know that you are registered is the fact that you receive collection envelopes, either on a regular basis or only at Christmas or Easter.
