Below are our Covid-related Chapel Guidelines

- Masks must be worn before entering the building until after leaving it.
- Chapel occupancy is limited to no more than 4 people at any one time, with 4 prayer places spaced according to correct social distancing.
- Chapel door will be locked at all times. Door code will be given to adorers.
- No sign-in book will be used.
- Hand sanitizers and wipes will be available for adorers' use. Each adorer will be asked to wipe her/his seating location before leaving the Chapel.
- The Chapel windows will be cracked open to allow fresh air to enter the room.
- No books/devotional items are in the Chapel, but adorers may bring their own and then take them back home.

Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic (Confirmed).

An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly, by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

TRINITY SUNDAY

This week begins with **Trinity Sunday** which always follows Pentecost.

It celebrates the un-knowable relationship between the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit - and their loving support for us in our lives.

"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth."

Monday is the **Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**.

This week we recognize the sacrifices made by a number of martyrs in the Church.

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St. Justin**, Martyr.

Thursday we remember **St. Charles Lwanga and Companions**, Martyrs.

Saturday is the **Memorial of St. Boniface**, Bishop and Martyr.

This week is our only exposure to the **Book of Tobit** in the two year cycle of weekday readings.

The Book of Tobit is a novel in the Wisdom literature tradition. We read the story of the misfortunes Tobit and a young woman, named Sarah.

The story is about God's fidelity, even though they are tested, and their perseverance in prayer and works of charity.

The songs of praise in Tobit this week are extraordinary. Mark's Gospel offers stories of how Jesus is in the midst of a struggle with the religious leaders in Jerusalem who do not like them.

He tells them the Parable of the tenant farmers, telling them that the stone rejected by builders has become the cornerstone. They almost arrest him.

His opponents try to ensnare Jesus with questions about the temple tax, but he isn't trapped by them.

When they question him about the resurrection, Jesus tells a parable which teaches that God is the God of the living.

"to love your neighbor as yourself is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

When asked which is the first commandment, Jesus gives two - highlighting the equal importance of love of God and neighbor. Jesus is both Son of David and Messiah and Lord. Jesus warns of those who abuse widows on spiritual pretexts and tells his disciples to notice the widow who gave from her poverty.

Sunday in the US is the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. For the rest of the world, it is the **Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time**.

2021-2022 Faith Formation Program Descriptions

Grades 1-6 Hybrid Traditional Model:

Students will attend an in-person class one time per month (Tuesday or Wednesday) from 4:00 PM-5:15 PM ; then complete online assignments for rest of the month.

If COVID conditions improve, we will move to all in-person classes with no online assignments.

Grades 1-6 Family Faith:

Parents will teach children the monthly lessons at home with the assistance of online resources.

Students will also attend one half hour Zoom session for **5 months on Sundays after the 11:30 AM Mass** (times will be assigned by grade)

Families will attend 2 family retreats during Advent and Lent from 12:30 PM-3:00 PM on assigned Sundays

Grades 7-8:

Students will complete monthly assignments and community service & attend one in-person class per month (Tuesdays from 7:00 PM-8:15 PM)

If COVID conditions improve we will adjust in-person attendance accordingly.

Grade 9 Immediate Confirmation Prep:

Students will meet one time per month for an in-person session (Sundays starting at the 11:30 AM Mass until 2:00 PM) along with community service assignments

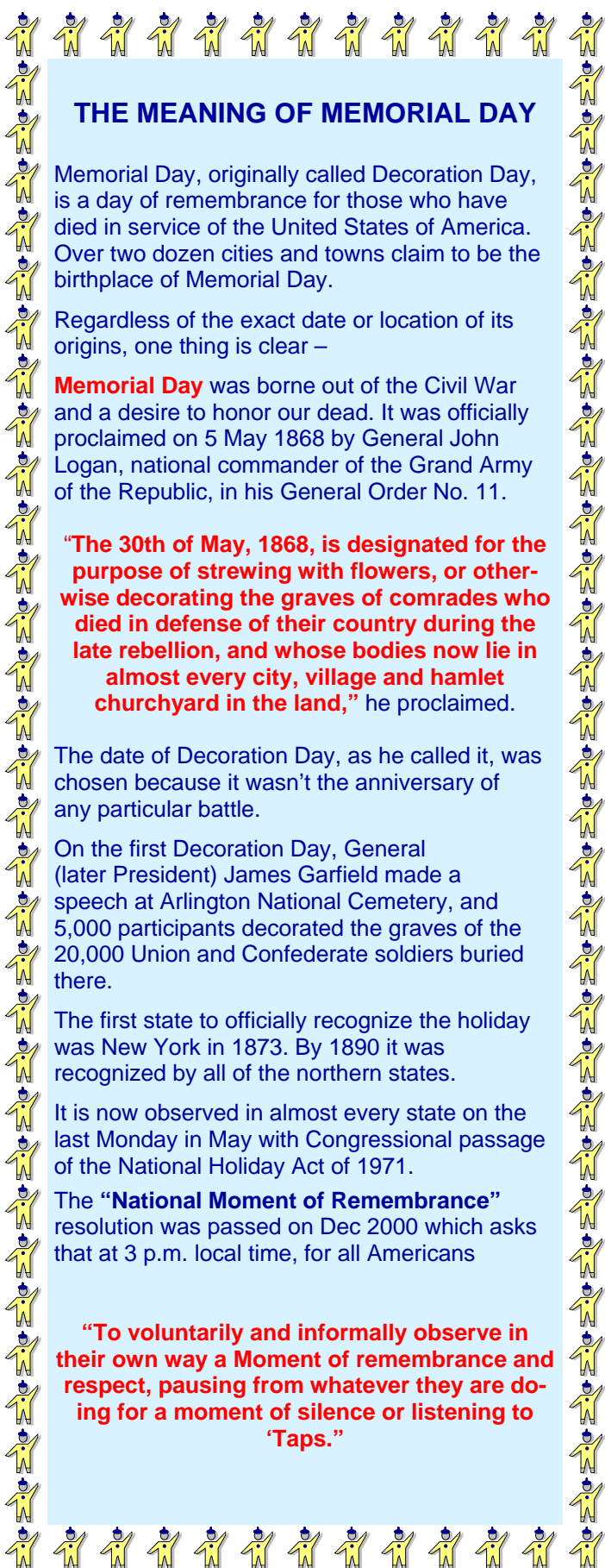

THE MEANING OF MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America. Over two dozen cities and towns claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day.

Regardless of the exact date or location of its origins, one thing is clear –

Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War and a desire to honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11.

"The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed.

The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

On the first Decoration Day, General (later President) James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there.

The first state to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890 it was recognized by all of the northern states.

It is now observed in almost every state on the last Monday in May with Congressional passage of the National Holiday Act of 1971.

The **"National Moment of Remembrance"** resolution was passed on Dec 2000 which asks that at 3 p.m. local time, for all Americans

"To voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a Moment of remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to 'Taps.'"

STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS
Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.
