Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For this **Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time** we finish our third Sunday with the Bread of Life readings from the 6th chapter of John's Gospel, meditating on the words of Jesus who reveals that he is the bread of life.

Some of his hearers grumble about these shocking words.

Jesus says,

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Tuesday is the **Feast of Saint Lawrence, deacon and martyr** and Wednesday the **Memorial of Saint Claire, Virgin**. Saturday is the **Memorial of Saint Maximilian Kolbe, Priest and Martyr**.

In the first readings this week from **Deuteronomy**, we hear about the entry into the Promised Land. Moses says farewell to the people.

Then we have readings from the **Book of Joshua**, who was the successor of Moses. The people cross the Jordan, with the Ark of the Covenant clearing a path through the river.

Joshua speaks to the people as a prophet and recounts all God has done for them. The people renew their covenant at Shechem.

In the daily readings from **Matthew's Gospel**, Jesus again warns his disciples about his upcoming passion, death and resurrection, but they are **"overwhelmed with grief."**

Jesus resolves the temple tax question, as if to say,

"it will be given you."

When the disciples are wondering about **"who is the greatest,"** Jesus points to a child and says the greatest is the one who is humble, like the defenseless child.

He tells them to care for each other

"If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone,"

and to pray together for anything they need. When Peter asks Jesus how many times we must forgive, Jesus tells the powerful parable of the servant who is forgiven his debt but doesn't forgive his debtors. Jesus urges us to forgive from our hearts. Jesus tells his disciples about the sacredness of marriage. The disciples tried to prevent people from bringing children to Jesus and he said,

"Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the Kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Sunday is the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** with its own special readings.

The Solemnity takes the place of the Twentieth Sunday of Ordinary Time.

**It's Time for Faith Formation
Update on Classes for the Fall**

The **Traditional Classroom Model** will return to meeting weekly on **Tuesdays** and **Wednesdays** - 4:00 PM-5:15 PM- beginning on **October 5th**.

Family Faith families will complete lessons together at home.

- Students will meet on Zoom **(1)** time per month for **(5)** months
- Have (2) family retreats:
Sunday, December 12 & **Sunday, March 6**
from 12:30 PM-3:00 PM

Grades 7 & 8 will be a hybrid program.

- Students will be attend in-person classes once a month on **Tuesdays** from 7:00 PM-8:15 PM - beginning on **October 5th**.
- Students will also complete assignments posted on Google Classroom the remainder of the time.

Grade 9 Confirmation:

- Will meet in-person **(1)** time per month on **Sundays** starting with the 11:30 AM Mass until 2:00 PM -beginning on **October 3rd**.

If you still need to register for the Fall:

Please go to ollfaithformation.org, click on the registration tab, then print out the volunteer, emergency, and registration forms.

Fill forms out completely, place in an envelope marked **"Faith Formation"** along with payment and drop it off at the rectory.

If you have a child entering 1st grade in the Fall and attending public school, it's time to register your child for Faith Formation.

The Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist take place in 2nd grade, but the preparation is a 2 year process that begins in 1st grade.

If you have a child entering 2nd or 9th grades and attending Catholic school, please contact the Faith Formation office to register for the Sacraments of 1st Eucharist, Reconciliation or Confirmation.

ARE YOU REGISTERED ?

We have people coming to Our Lady of Lourdes on a regular basis who need a form of some kind filled out and, when we check our records, we find that they are not registered parishioners.

ARE YOU REGISTERED AS A PARISHIONER OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES?

If you are not, it becomes more complicated if you need some kind of form to be filled out stating that you are a parishioner. The best way for you to know that you are registered is the fact that you receive collection envelopes, either on a regular basis or only at Christmas or Easter.

PLEASE – save yourself and our parish staff a great deal of time and trouble --Visit the PARISH office and register!

SPONSOR LETTERS

Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic (Confirmed). An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly, by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

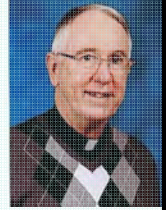
