Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

On the Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time we hear in Mark's Gospel as Jesus tell his disciples about his passion, death and resurrection to come in Jerusalem. Peter tries to prevent him from going there. Jesus rebukes him and tells the disciples and us that to be a disciple is to follow him, not trying to save one's life, but by dying to ourselves and losing ourselves for his sake and that of the Gospel. That is the only path to real life. Monday is the Memorial of Saint John Chrysostom, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Tuesday is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross and Wednesday is the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. Both days have their own special readings. Thursday is the Memorial of Saints Cornelius, Pope, and Cyprian, Bishop, Martyrs.

We continue reading from Paul's First Letter to Timothy. It begins this week with the great prayer for our leaders. He then says how bishops and deacons should behave. He urges Timothy to be especially caring for the youth. Paul warns Timothy of the troubles of riches. Finally, Paul encourages Timothy to be faithful. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus praises the faith of the Roman centurion who understands Jesus' power to heal. Jesus then raises from the dead the son of the widow of Nain. In response to constant criticism from religious authorities, Jesus compares the critics to children taunting their playmates. We read of the woman who entered a dinner Jesus was attending and wept over his feet, washing them with her tears, showing what real love is.

Luke, who highlights the role of women in his gospel, tells us of women who accompanied Jesus and his disciples. Finally, Jesus gives us the Parable of the Sower and its interpretation about how temptations and shallow roots can prevent the Word from growing in us or how "the anxieties and riches and pleasures of life" can choke the Word.

On the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time we hear Jesus tell his disciples about his passion, death and resurrection a second time. It is clear to him that they didn't understand the first time. He knew that, along the way, they had been arguing about who was the greatest. He gathers the Apostles and says to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

**SPONSOR LETTERS**

Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic (Confirmed). An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly, by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

**ARE YOU REGISTERED ?**

We have people coming to Our Lady of Lourdes on a regular basis who need a form of some kind filled out and, when we check our records, we find that they are not registered parishioners.

**ARE YOU REGISTERED AS A PARISHIONER OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES?**

If you are not, it becomes more complicated if you need some kind of form to be filled out stating that you are a parishioner. The best way for you to know that you are registered is the fact that you receive collection envelopes, either on a regular basis or only at Christmas or Easter.

SUBJECT: VACCINE MANDATES

DATE: AUGUST 27, 2021

I have been asked to clarify the teaching of the Church regarding the morality of receiving the vaccines against COVID-19 and to articulate archdiocesan policy on the matter. Concretely, there is a pastoral need to answer the question of whether the faithful may request an exemption on religious grounds from accepting the vaccines. We have received some questions here in the Archdiocesan Center. You likely have had to field similar requests.

It is important to note that the Archdiocese of Newark does not provide for an exemption on religious grounds from receiving the vaccine. Any concerns based upon our respect for life teachings have been addressed. In addition, it has been noted that reception of the vaccine can be seen as an act of charity in support of the common good. In a recent public service announcement, Pope Francis called receiving the vaccine an "act of love." The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have issued statements in support of the morality of receiving the vaccine as have a number of American bishops.

As such it is not possible for a Catholic to claim an exemption from vaccination on religious grounds. Like anyone else, a Catholic may claim a personal exemption on the grounds of conscience but such a decision should consider our Christian responsibility to work for the common good in service to the benefit of all.

Therefore, you should not support a religious exemption for the people entrusted to your pastoral care. If you are approached with such a request, kindly remind the unvaccinated of their obligation to preserve the health of others and themselves by wearing a mask, maintaining social distance, getting tested as necessary, and other recommended safety measures.
