ARE YOU REGISTERED ?

We have people coming to Our Lady of Lourdes on a regular basis who need a form of some kind filled out and, when we check our records, we find that they are not registered parishioners. **ARE YOU REGISTERED AS A PARISHIONER OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES?** If you are not, it becomes more complicated if you need some kind of form to be filled out stating that you are a parishioner. The best way for you to know that you are registered is the fact that you receive collection envelopes, either on a regular basis or only at Christmas or Easter. PLEASE – save yourself and our parish staff a great deal of time and trouble -- Visit the PARISH office and register!

Sponsor Letters—Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, fully-initiated Catholic (Confirmed). An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly, by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we read Luke's Gospel of the Annunciation, the moment when a troubled Mary is told she has found favor with God and she will conceive and bear a son. She questions: "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" Then declaring herself the handmaiden of the Lord, she accepts: "May it be done to me according to your word."

This week we hear from the Song of Songs and Hannah's prayer and of Mary's visit to Elizabeth and her song. We read from Malachai of the foretelling of John's birth, and his birth story in Luke. David promises to build a temple and Zacharia's song prepare us for Christmas.

Friday is Christmas Day this year. The first celebration of The Nativity of the Lord is the Mass at Midnight. The first reading is from Isaiah: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." This powerful reading deserves a slow contemplation. The Gospel is from Luke: the journey to Bethlehem, the birth, the angels announce the birth to the shepherds. The second celebration of The Nativity of the Lord is the Mass at Dawn. The Gospel is from Luke: the shepherds visit the newborn child. "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." The third celebration of The Nativity of the Lord is the Mass during the Day. Here the Gospel is from the beginning of John's Gospel: "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

Then, the church celebrates three very important feasts after Christmas. We celebrate the Feast of Saint Stephen, the first public witness who gave his life for his faith. Then we celebrate the Feast of Saint John, Apostle and evangelist. And, we encounter the moving Feast of the Holy Innocents, remembering the infant martyrs of Herod's jealous rage.

**POPE FRANCIS
CHRISTMAS MESSAGE 2020**

Today “a great light” shines forth (Is 9:1); the light of Jesus’ birth shines all about us. How true and timely are the words of the prophet Isaiah which we have just heard: “You have brought abundant joy and great rejoicing” (9:2)! Our heart was already joyful in awaiting this moment; now that joy abounds and overflows, for the promise has been at last fulfilled. Joy and gladness are a sure sign that the message contained in the mystery of this night is truly from God.

Today, the Son of God is born, and everything changes. The Savior of the world comes to partake of our human nature; no longer are we alone and forsaken. The Virgin offers us her Son as the beginning of a new life. The true light has come to illumine our lives so often beset by the darkness of sin. Today we once more discover who we are! Tonight we have been shown the way to reach the journey’s end. Now must we put away all fear and dread, for the light shows us the path to Bethlehem. We must set out to see our Savior lying in a manger. This is the reason for our joy and gladness: this Child has been “born to us”; he was “given to us”, as Isaiah proclaims (cf. 9:5). The people who for two thousand years has traversed all the pathways of the world in order to allow every man and woman to share in this joy is now given the mission of making known “the Prince of peace” and becoming his effective servant in the midst of the nations.

Like the shepherds of Bethlehem, may we too, with eyes full of amazement and wonder, gaze upon the Child Jesus, the Son of God. And in his presence may our hearts burst forth in prayer: “Show us, Lord, your mercy, and grant us your salvation” (Ps 85:8).

With gratitude and praise, we hasten to the manger of Bethlehem. Like shepherds and magi, we gaze in awe, and open our hearts.

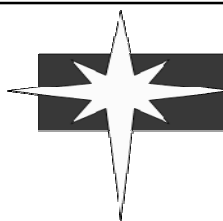

A Christmas Message from Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin

On Christmas Day, we celebrate first and foremost, the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Christmas is a joyous time that invites us to welcome God's love into our hearts, and to share this love with others throughout the New Year.

During the season of Advent, I often reflect on the Gospel of Luke—specifically the conversation between the angel Gabriel and Mary, our Blessed Mother. In the Gospel, St. Luke tells us that Gabriel appeared before Mary, and he told her that she will give birth to the "Son of the Most High" (Lk 1:33)—and that she will name him Jesus.

In response to this, Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38).

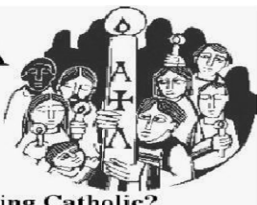
This conversation between Gabriel and Mary leads us to the most profound meaning of Christmas: God loves us so much that he gave up everything in order to become one with us. Through Mary, he made it possible for us to identify with him, and to recognize his humanity.
